Answers and Solutions

1:- D

Solution: Talisman is an object like a ring or a stone worn by people that is believed to have magic powers to bring good fortune to the person wearing it.

Here it is the correct word suitable for the sentence and no improvement is needed.

2:- C

Solution: "sturdily" is a better word meaning "of firm build"

3:- A

Solution: "forge" means "work area" in the context here. Option A is better suited in the sentence.

4:- C

Solution: "whereupon" means 'immediately after which" and it is the correct word suitable in the sentence.

5:- C

Solution: "movable arm" is correctly suited in the sentence.

6:- B

Solution: "only a means to an end" is the correct expression

7:- B

Solution: "deflected" means to get deviated from its original path by an obstruction. It is the correct word to be put in the sentence.

8:- D

Solution: "availed of" is a transitive verb which means "to make use of".

9:- B

Solution: Since subject is singular, verb should be in singular form

10:- B

Solution: The adverb 'clearly" should come after the verb "understand"

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
